It's easy to use, works great on my android device with Kindle app and on my computer. The original publication date is 1871, so if you need a dictionary that hails from a time when we didn't stare at screens and self induce ADD, this will probably work for you. HENDERSONI'm using a kindle Touch - which is not the latest thing so maybe it looks better on a newer model. But I doubt it. The layout is terrible. A normal reference book would have each new entry start on a new line. Instead, we have: Word: synonym, synonym, synonym; Nextword: synonym, synonym, synonym; newword: synonym, etc. (going by memory so the punctuation may be other than as I recall; and the main entry words are in bold type, lthough that doesn't show up well when searching.) Also, I expected each letter to be in a separate chapter. Or possibly even sub-headings for letters that are especially common. instead, it's all one big chapter. The table of contents reads as follows: beginning cover preface end That's it. no easy way to find any letter, or any particular word even. Of course, I was impatient and tried to use it before it was "indexed". As it is, its been several hours and it's still not indexed yet, so I can't use the search feature until it is. But the layout is very poor in any case. BUT - it was free. And the word list, while not exhaustive, is fairly good. so there's that. Basically, it does what it claims but it's very hard to use. The cost didn't affect my rating at all. If you want to mentally add a star "because it is free" I think that could make sense. Otherwise, it's a solid two-star effort (5 out of 15 on my own personal scale) EDIT: correction. So now it finished indexing and I can search. I tried a search for "sacrifice" to see how it worked. Came back with three or four instances, and only one showed up as "Sacrifice, n." (N for noun) So it wasn't too hard to identify the correct entry. When I selected the entry, it first came up in the same ugly, run-together format, I described above. But when I paged backward one page and then forward again it suddenly changed to be formatted like a regular dictionary! So obviously the problem is that whatever they used as a carriage return/line terminator character is something that Kindle isn't really equipped to handle. So sometimes it looks okay and sometimes not. Which means it is really 's fault and not the editor/publisher. But I'm not changing my rating because it's still crappy formatting given the limitations of the device.
