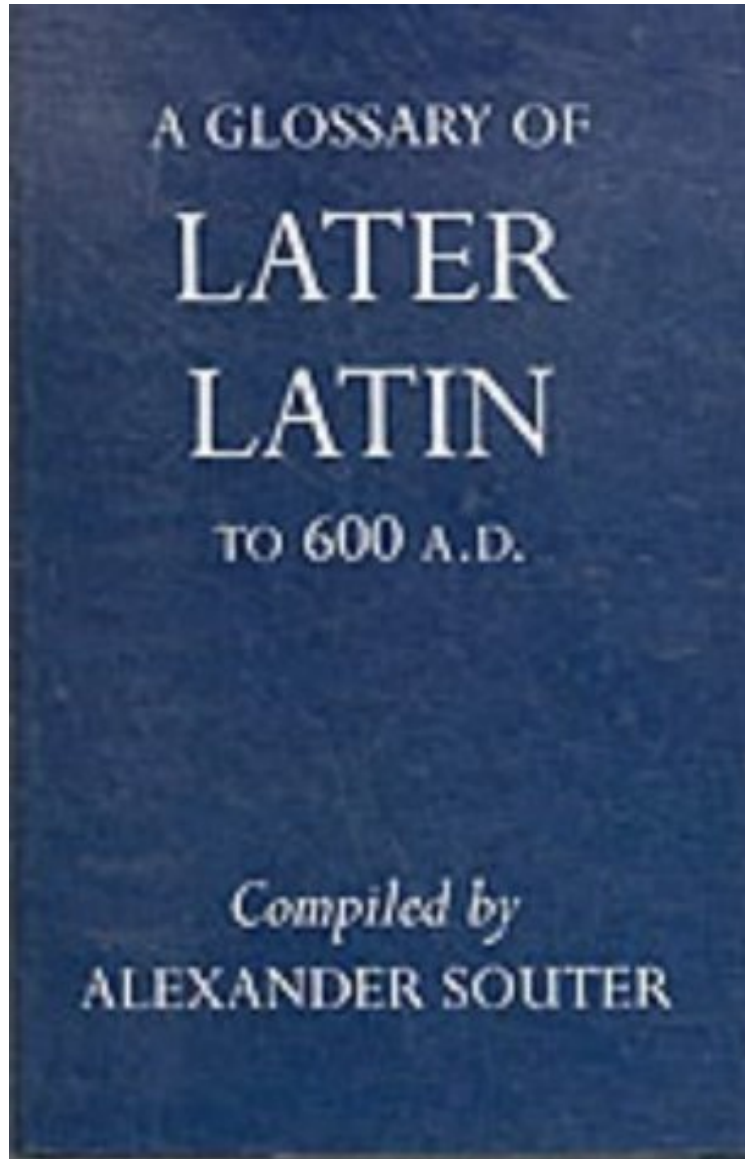

There were no really adequate dictionaries for medieval Latin, and Souter includes many terms and usages not in Lewis and Short. I just purchased a copy and have

already used it several times. If you are working with patristic or early medieval ecclesiastical Latin, this is better (but it used) than Niemeyer (later and primarily historical Latin) or Latham's Revised Medieval Latin Word List from British and Irish Sources and cheaper than Blaise, let alone titles such as the Dictionary of Medieval Latin from British Sources.

Alexander Souter was a Scottish biblical scholar, specializing in the text of the New Testament and Latin commentaries on the Pauline epistles. In 1937 he became editor-in-chief of what was envisioned to be the Oxford Latin Dictionary, but World War II ultimately led to his producing this more sharply-focused Glossary.
